## What You'll need:

- -Fabric
- Stuffing and beanbag filling
- Black pompoms
- -Scissors, Needle, and Thread


Please note that you are not allowed to sell this pattern or any plush made with it.


This is not a stand-alone pattern, there are no instructions for how to sew all the pieces together included in this document. Only the sized up sewing pattern and instructions on how to properly stuff the beanbag. The primary octopus pattern and instructions are required.


There are a lot of pages to print up in this pattern, make sure you have enough ink and paper before starting! Print all of the pages and start taping together the shapes. Cut along the dotted lines and connect the pieces using the letters as a guide. For example, A connects to A and B connects to B. Once the whole pattern is taped together start copying all of the marks from the smaller pattern onto your larger pieces. These include the name of the piece, fur direction, and amount to cut. These were not included in this pattern to save on printer ink


Now that you have all of the pattern pieces sized up and labeled, just follow the instructions on the primary octopus pattern on how to sew everything together. There are only a few small adjustments you will need to make. When sewing all of the tentacles to the bottom piece, you should lightly stuff them with polyester stuffing instead of leaving them empty. They should be able to move and flop around. Next, when stuffing the main body of the octopus you will need to make a funnel with paper to help you get the beanbag filling in. I recommend only filling the bottom half with the beanbag filling. You should stuff the head and the top half of the mantle with regular stuffing. By doing this, the octopus will be sturdy and soft to sit on, while not looking deflated. Getting the right ratio of stuffing to beanbag filling might take some trial and error but keep at it until it feels right to you. If you look to the right, the blue areas show where the beanbag filling should be, and the yellow where the stuffing should go. Finally, for the eyes, I would suggest using large black pompoms and sewing them to the beanbag. I made my eyes our of resin, but I would not recommend doing this, because they where a pain to attach and are very heavy. With these alterations, you are


